Baggage Carousel Replacement

Design of a new baggage carousel for Yuma International Airport is underway. The new equipment will be quieter, feature an added measure of safety and the new configuration will have additional capacity that will help passengers collect their baggage after arriving. Installation is anticipated to begin late November and will take a couple of weeks to complete.

GA Apron Rehabilitation

Yuma International Airport held a kickoff meeting to design the rehabilitation of approximately 48,700 SY of existing general aviation aprons by repairing or replacing the deteriorated asphalt and concrete sections. The design project is funded by the FAA and ADOT. The design will be complete by early 2021.

YUMA AIRPORT AVIATOR UPDATES

Civil Air Patrol Squadron 508

Two cadet officers from the Yuma 508 CAP squadron provided a presentation during an online Civil Air Patrol Aerospace Education workshop sponsored by the Arizona Wing of the Civil Air Patrol.

Cadet 2nd Lieutenant Joey Burkart discussed the important role of aerospace education in cadet promotions at all levels of the cadet program. He explained the importance of aerospace reading assignments and associated testing based on the monograph Journey of Flight that senior members must complete to earn their Yeager Award. He shared prior to joining the Civil Air Patrol he had not thought of pursuing a profession in the aerospace field. Burkart explained that his interest in an aerospace career has been inspired by his CAP cadet experiences.

Cadet Captain Tristan Obregon shared his personal experiences in Civil Air Patrol and how aerospace education has enhanced his appreciation of the cadet program. He began his cadet experience with a natural interest in becoming a pilot but he knew little about the field. Flights with the Young Eagle program and O-flights in CAP helped provide focus for that interest. He has been a cadet leader of the 508 model rocketry program. He has participated in field trips to both the USS Midway Museum and the Palm Springs Air Museum. Cadet Obregon plans a career in military aviation.

Local Pilots

Local pilots Joe Fisher and Tim Frank, along with their wives, were invited to participate and fly in an historic formation to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II.

The couples traveled to the island of Oahu, Hawaii bringing along Joe Fisher's North American T-6 Texan 1954 vintage aircraft that Joe re-built after it was scrapped about 50 years ago.

Joe shared "There are very few World War II veterans that are left and this is the last time we may have to honor those who died and honor those who are still with us." Joe continued "What Americans need to realize is freedom isn't free, and there are a lot of men and women that sacrifice their time and their lives for our freedom."

Frank shared he was honored to be a part of this 75th commemoration and celebratory day in history because the war has important meaning to his family.

"My father was a World War II vet and he actually fought in the Pacific, so an opportunity to come and celebrate the victory over Japan here in Hawaii was an opportunity that I certainly wouldn't pass up."



A NEW RUNWAY FOR SOMERTON AIRPORT

Local aviators are celebrating as construction of a newly paved runway at Somerton Airport is complete. Having a paved runway has been a lifelong dream of the airport's owner, Eric Saltzer and his late father, Charles Saltzer.

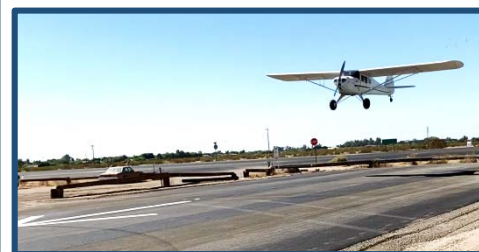
Somerton Airport is privately owned by the Saltzer Family Trust who purchased it in 2002. For decades Charles Saltzer managed the airport and made improvements including construction of hangars, runway lighting, fuel services along with picnic and camping areas for use by local and transient aviators. Throughout his ownership Charles also advocated for a paved runway, however because the airport is privately owned, it does not qualify for state or federal grant funding.

In 2013 the Yuma County Airport Authority (YCAA) agreed to provide funding to pave the main runway at Somerton Airport, contingent upon funds being available, in exchange for a recorded easement by the Saltzer Family Trust, guaranteeing Public Use of Somerton Airport. On June 11, 2013 such an easement was created and recorded as agreed however, due to the recession of 2012, funding was not available.

Yuma International Airport Director, Gladys Brown shared "Completion of this project has always been important to the YCAA as it helps to promote and foster civil aviation in Yuma County. In the summer of 2019, the YCAA readdressed the subject and subsequently authorized the expenditure of approximately \$22,000 from the Airport's FY19 budget for the runway's design. In April 2020, the YCAA committed to reimbursing the Saltzer Family Trust two-thirds of the cost to pave the runway."

During preparation for the asphalt to be laid, Eric, along with friends and family, respected his father's wishes and interred his father's ashes into the runway subsurface. Longtime friend and contractor, Don Peterson laid the first strip of asphalt onto the runway personally. Once the runway was paved and properly marked, Eric Saltzer (who is also a pilot) took a couple of family members up for the first flight in his father's 1946 Taylorcraft to celebrate its completion, and landed safely on the newly paved surface.

The Saltzer Family Trust is thankful and proud to have partnered with the Yuma County Airport Authority to make this dream a reality in an effort to promote and foster general aviation far into the future.
